

The American Brass Band

A brass band is a musical ensemble consisting of only brass instruments with a percussion section, usually comprised of about thirty players. Because of their mellow and warm sound, American brass bands use French horns instead of tenor horns, which are used by our British and European brass band cousins. American brass bands were very active as early as the Civil War era. For almost 100 years, local brass bands provided the only ensemble music available to American towns. They were sponsored by townspeople, factories and businesses, as well as lodges and fire departments. American brass bands helped bring classical music, marches and popular songs to the American frontier.

Today, there is a renewed interest in the brass band movement. Great composers worldwide are writing original works for this specific ensemble. The music is highly complex and very challenging to the players. Remember that today, you will hear a band perform that has no woodwinds or strings....only brass and percussion, which takes a high-degree of technical ability and musicianship.

Robert D. Jorgensen, Conductor

Has served as Director of Bands and Professor of Music at The University of Akron since 1987. Mr. Jorgensen was elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association in 1991 and is currently President of the organization. He is also Part President of the Mid-American Conference Bands Directors Association.

Professor Jorgensen has been widely honored as a music educator and band conductor. He received the Outstanding Bandmasters Award from the International Assembly of Phi Beta Mu, International Bandmasters Fraternity at the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, Illinois, in 1999. He received the Citation of Excellence Award from the National Band Association 1981 and the A. Frank Martin Award from Kappa Kappa Psi in 1992. Mr. Jorgensen earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Illinois and a Master's degree from Michigan State University, where he was a student of Leonard Falcone and Kenneth Bloomquist. From 1969-1972, he was euphonium soloist with the United States Army Field Band in Washington, D.C.
