We are providing this information to update you about resources you are gaining or losing access to in the collection. Additions

Wayne College has subscribed to [Films on Demand Nursing Current Concepts](#) videos starting October 1st for one year. The Akron campus also has access to these videos.

E-books

OhioLINK was awarded additional Governor’s Emergency Education Relief (GEER) funds and will purchase four new collections of e-books and streaming video. A detailed breakdown of what resources will be purchased is below.

Cancellations

While UL continues to work hard on cost control and budget management, some cancellations are still necessary at this time for us to be able to meet all of our commitments.

University Libraries will provide as much notice as possible when resources are to be discontinued in an effort to lessen disruption to our users. Reductions to library collections will continue to be shared via Digest updates and directly with departments. Additionally, University Libraries provides and archives a quarterly update of resource changes (this report) via IdeaExchange@Uakron.

JoVE Core Science Videos and Lab Manual Access Ends December 31st, 2022. In 2021, OhioLINK was awarded GEER funds through the Ohio Department of Higher Education to support the education community during the public health emergency. Of the five resources that OhioLINK acquired using GEER funding for 2021, two included perpetual access to purchased content, and three were subscriptions where access was set to end at a certain date. The Jove subscription included two years of access, from 1/1/2021 – 12/31/2022.

Resource Notes and Updates

[Statista](#) is now upgraded to the **Statista Campus International**. This expanded content includes Statista Outlooks and a Business Plan Export feature for students.

Records for the open access e-books in the **National Center for Biotechnology Information Advances** (NCBI) Bookshelf will be added to OhioLINK's Central Catalog. These e-books will now be more accessible to patrons searching for content in OhioLINK.

E-books from the **American Psychological Association** (APA) have been loaded into OhioLINK's Electronic Book Central (EBC). The books were purchased by OhioLINK in 2017-2020 and will remain accessible from the APA website, but can now also be searched while using the EBC. You can also access these e-books through the [APA module](#) in the EBC.

As of January 1, 2023 UA will have access to additional e-journals published by the **Institute of Physics** (IOP) and unlimited open access publishing through 2025. This deal was negotiated through OhioLINK and includes the ECS Digital package University Libraries previously subscribed to.
