## AU CHRONICLE REPLACES UNIVERSITY FACULTY BULLETIN

## TENTATIVE FALL 1971 ENROLLMENT FIGURES

The tentative credit enrollment for the fall quarter 1971 has reached an all-time high of 19,859. The noncredit registration in special programs through the Evening College will exceed 2,156, so that our grand total enrollment for the beginning of the 1971-72 academic year will approximate 22,015.

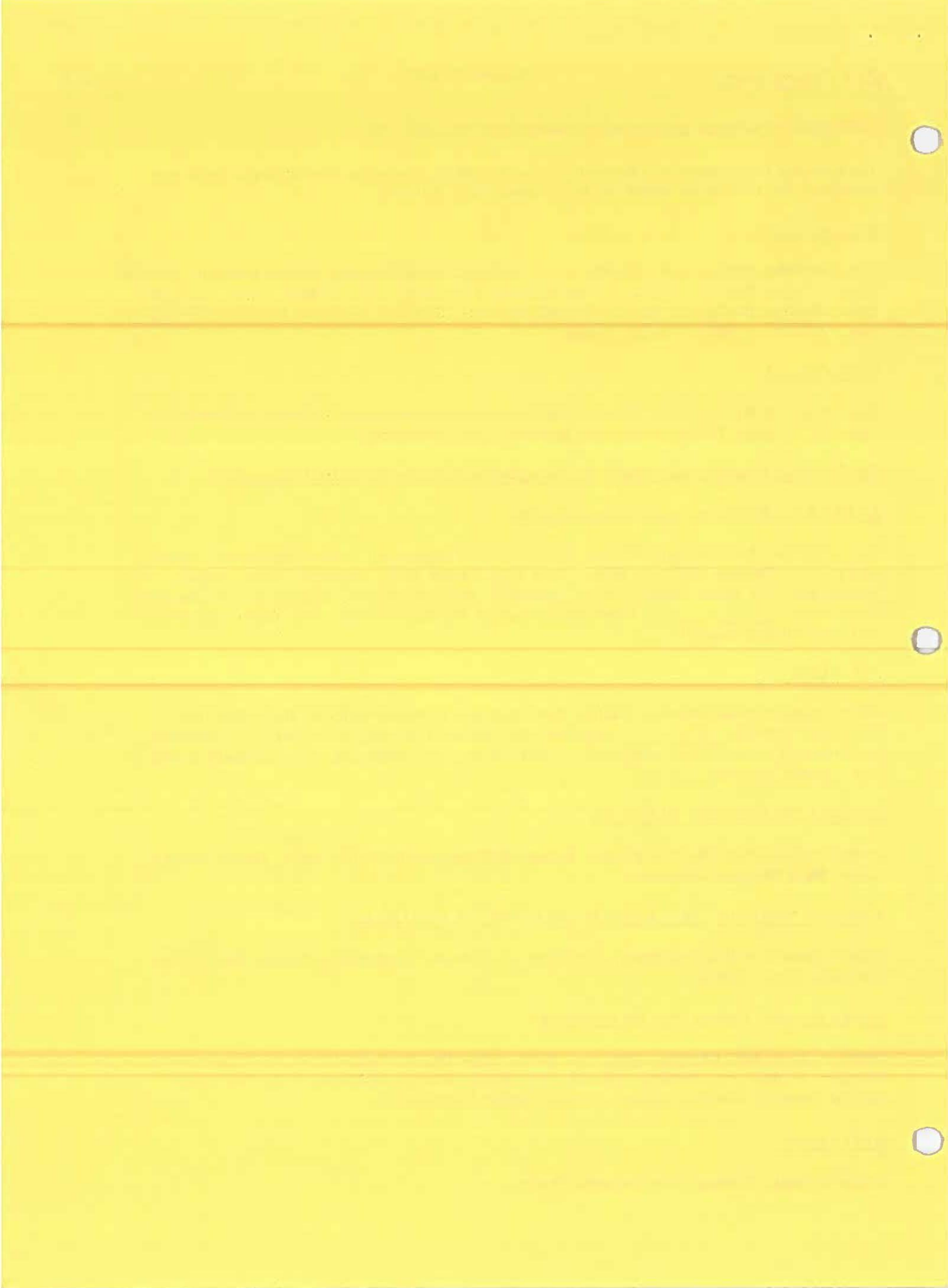

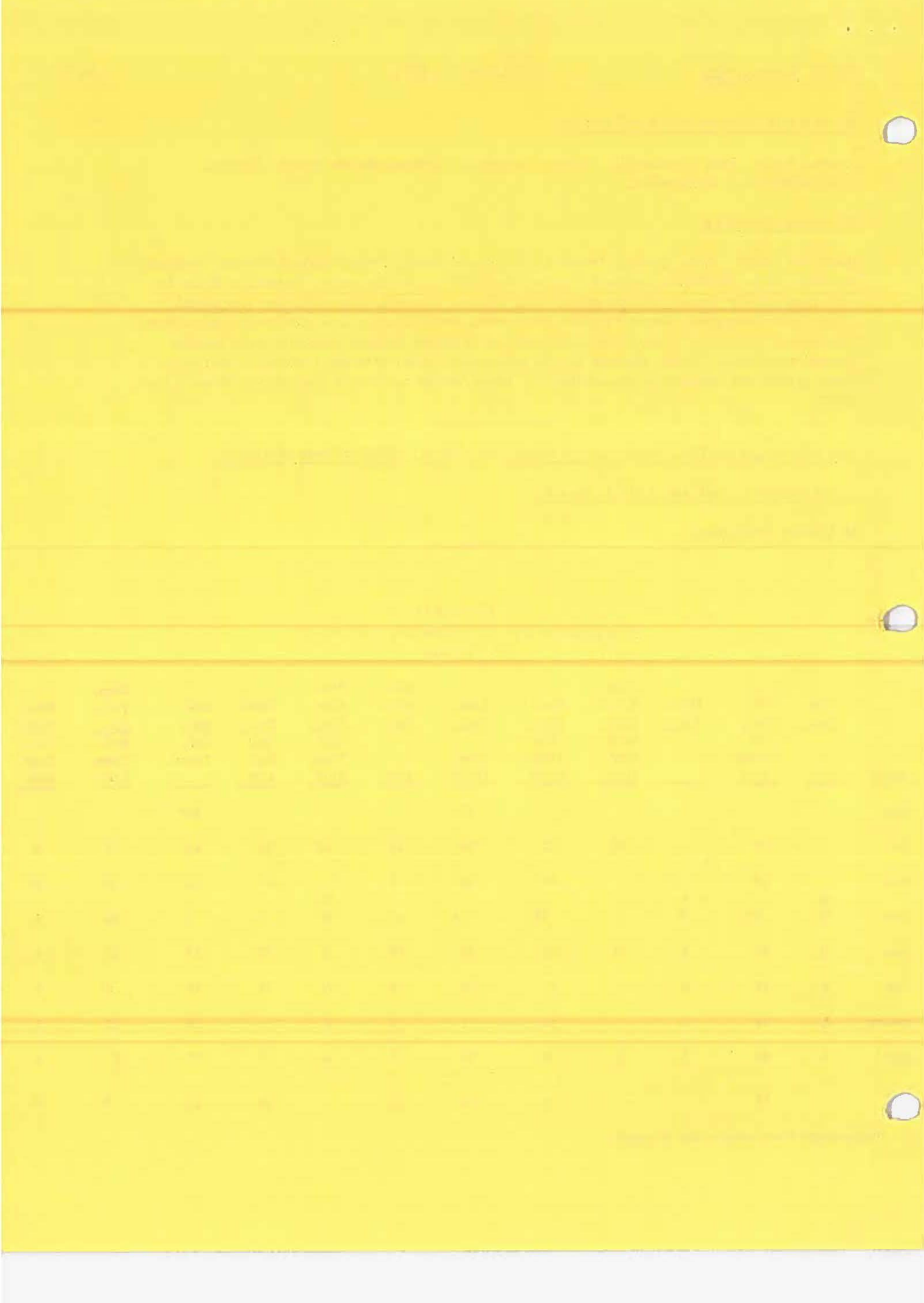
