Greetings from the President

It is my pleasure to extend a cordial welcome to all new and returning faculty members as The University of Akron begins its 104th year.

We look forward to the stimulating association with our colleagues, to the challenge of the classroom and inquisitive minds, and to the many structural changes on campus which evidence further progress in our intellectual, cultural and physical development.

This 1973-74 academic year holds promise of rewarding implementation of recommendations from our Educational Research and Development Center to enhance and improve the teaching/learning process; of accelerated encouragement and prosecution of faculty professional research activities; of broader personal and institutional involvement in the arena of public services; of wider opportunities, through the Edwin J.
